

**Miladin Batalović** je z devetimi leti začel igrati violino v Kragujevcu, končal Glasbeno gimnazijo Kornelije Stanković v Beogradu, kjer je kot solist z orkestrom nastopil z Bruchovim koncertom v g-molu in prejel nagrado za izjemne dosežke. Študiral je v Stuttgartu pri Gerhardu Vossu in Antoniu Spillerju in z odliko dokončal magistrski študij sodobne glasbe pri profesorju Joachimu Schallu. V sezoni 2005/06 je bil član münchenskega radijskega orkestra in sočasno obiskoval mojstrske tečaje pri Wolframu Königu in Jorgeju Sutilu. Od leta 2007 je vodja drugih violin v Simfoničnem orkestru SNG Maribor.

**Nikolaj Sajko** je diplomiral iz violončela v razredu Cirila Škerjanca na Akademiji za glasbo v Ljubljani, kjer je končal tudi znanstveni magistrski študij, podiplomsko pa se je v solistični igri izpopolnjeval na Univerzi Antona Brucknerja v Linzu. Je dobitnik Klasincove diplome in nagrade Antonia Tarsie, pomembne uvrstitve pa je dosegel tudi na državnih in mednarodnih tekmovanjih mladih glasbenikov v Gorici, Lieznu, Zagrebu in Ljubljani. Bil je član mednarodnega mladinskega orkestra Gustav Mahler in član Svetovnega orkestra glasbene mladine. Od leta 2006 je namestnik soločelista v Simfoničnem orkestru SNG Maribor, do leta 2023 je poučeval tudi na Konservatoriju za glasbo in balet v Mariboru. Od leta 2012 programsko vodi cikel komornih koncertov Carpe artem. Od marca 2024 poučuje in koordinira oddelek komorne igre na Univerzi za umetnost v Gradcu v Avstriji.

**Miladin Batalović** started playing violin in Kragujevac at the age of nine, graduated from the Kornelija Stanković Music High School in Belgrade, where he performed Bruch's Concerto in G minor as a soloist with the orchestra and received the prize for outstanding achievement. He studied in Stuttgart with Gerhard Voss and Antonio Spiller and completed his Master's degree in contemporary music with distinction with Professor Joachim Schall. In the 2005/06 season he was a member of the Munich Radio Orchestra and simultaneously attended masterclasses with Wolfram König and Jorge Sutil. Since 2007 he has been the leader of the second violins in the Symphony Orchestra of the National Symphony Orchestra Maribor.

**Nikolaj Sajko** graduated in cello in the class of Cyril Škerjanec at the Academy of Music in Ljubljana, where he also completed his Master's degree, and he did postgraduate studies in solo performance at the Anton Bruckner University in Linz. He has won the Klasinc Diploma and the Antonio Tarsia Prize, and has also achieved important results at national and international competitions for young musicians in Gorizia, Liezen, Zagreb and Ljubljana. He was a member of the Gustav Mahler International Youth Orchestra and a member of the World Youth Orchestra. Since 2006 he has been the associate solo cellist of the Symphony Orchestra of the Slovene National Theatre Maribor, and until 2023 he also taught at the Conservatory of Music and Ballet in Maribor. Since 2012 he has been the programme director of the chamber concert series Carpe artem. Since March 2024 he has been teaching and coordinating the chamber music department at the University of Music and Performing Arts in Graz, Austria.
